# SOCIALLY USEFUL AND PRODUCTIVE ACTIVITY

Under the SUPA (Socially Useful and Productive Activity) program, 276 students volunteered with NGOs from January 2 to 30, 2025. By participating in this activity, students gained first-hand experience of socio-economic issues at the grassroot level while making meaningful contributions to the cause of their respective organisations. Recommendations from both students and the SUPA coordinator were taken into consideration to shortlist the NGOs where the students engaged for their internship. From the list, XIME Society extended financial support of ₹3 lakhs each in and around Karnataka region to three NGOs namely Mitra Jyothi, UPAY (Under Privileged Advancement by Youth), and Jeevarathni.

## GLOBAL EXPOSURE THROUGH STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

In the month of January 2025, XIME students had the opportunity to attend an educational session at Audencia Business School's Atlantic Campus in Nantes, France. Goulam Houssen Rais, a student from Audencia who





joined XIME from Sep-Dec 2024, enrolling in core management courses. Moreover, XIME's collaboration with Nagoya University of Commerce and Business (NUCB) in Japan opened doors for another global exchange, where two students will be attending NUCB, Japan during May and June 2025, enriching their global educational journey.

## GUEST LECTURE BY MR. JACOB CHANDY VARGHESE

On 14 February 2025, students of first year attended a guest lecture conducted by Mr. Jacob Chandy Varghese, Head of Product Management (EDGE, Bangalore), with over 30 years of experience in the industry, who shared his insights on business entrepreneurship, intrapreneurship, social entrepreneurship, and the tech product industry. The students eagerly learnt about the process of new product development, its life cycle, and the typical causes of product failure in the market.

## MARIA PHILIP FUTURE LEADERS DEBATE 2025: THE GRAND FINALE

XIME Bangalore hosted the grand finale of the Maria Philip Future Leaders Debate 2025. The event paid tribute to Ms. Maria Philip's legacy, with the Chairman, Prof. J. Philip, emphasising the event's role in cultivating public speaking and debate abilities for tomorrow's leaders.

Organised by the X-Oration club, more than 200 students from all South Indian states participated in regional and state rounds before eight finalists were shortlisted for the finale. The debate, on the topic "Friendly relations between India and China are an impossible prospect for the near future," was judged by a panel of dignitaries Ms. Chandrika Rai, VP and Head of CPA Software & Diagnostics, Volvo Group; Mr. Srimanto Bhattacharya, Co-Founder & Senior Partner at Spearhead Intersearch; Mr. Gagandeep Singh, Head of Product Validation at Ather Energy; Mr. Abhijeet Piyush Jain, Global Product Portfolio Manager at TVS Motor Company; Mr. Sreejith Nair, Deputy Manager at Titan Company. Judges evaluated the participants on content depth, delivery, and communication skills.

Competitors Mr. Krishnanand Prajith Menon and Ms. Janet Eldho from Rajagiri College, Kochi won the competition, receiving ₹80,000 and a trophy. Ms. Pooja Chawan and Ms. Ananya Kadakol from JSS College, Dharwad secured the runners-up position, receiving ₹40,000 each. Ms. Ifra Ayesha from Roshini Nilaya was declared the Best Speaker and received a prize of ₹40,000. A total prize pool of ₹5,00,000 was distributed across regional, state final and South India levels.

In partnership with Adelaide Business School, Australia, XIME organised an International Conference. A panel discussion on 'Global Perspectives in Management Education,' was moderated by Dr. Krishna Kumar Nallur, Associate Professor, XIME Bangalore with distinguished panellists Dr. Rajeev Kamaneni (Adelaide Business School, University of Adelaide), Dr. Apurva Sanaria (IIM Bangalore) and Dr. Or Lustig (Matrix Media & University of Haifa). An all women panel led by Dr. Nagamani Nagaraja (Chief of Strategy and Operations, Global Academy of Technology), Dr. Madhumita Chatterjee (Director, Acharya Business School), Ms. Mridula (Co-founder, Kreedo), Ms. Kavyanidhi (Leader of Strategy and Operations, Cisco) and Ms. Chandrika Shetty (VP, Volvo Group) discussed "Business

Schools and Social Responsibility: Are We Doing Enough?." The research paper presentations, held on March 7-8, 2025, featured 32 papers on topics like diversity, sustainability, and social responsibility in management education. Two Master Classes on Global Perspectives in Management Education were conducted by Dr. Ankit Agarwal (Program Director, Bachelor of Business, University of Adelaide) and Dr. Thomas Kuruvilla (Managing Partner, Arthur D. Little). The conference offered networking opportunities for academicians and industry experts.

## GUEST LECTURE BY MR. RAJESH KUMAR

Mr. Rajesh Kumar Dash, Associate Vice President at Duroflex, conducted a session on Integrated Marketing Communication (IMC). He delivered an engaging speech titled "IMC and Promotion Decoded: How Brands Build Trust, Influence, and Sales-The Duroflex Story." He mentioned that integrated marketing is not necessarily





about having continuous visuals but instead about creating an integrated, customerfocused experience. From his words, learners understood the brand's evolution from generic communications to a powerful positioning of "Great Sleep, Great Health". He emphasised the importance of confidence and consistency in IMC, leveraging insights into health and sleep for strategic positioning, and utilising a combination of traditional advertising, influencer marketing, digital platforms, and experiential retail. He also emphasised the importance of educational content, such as sleep science blogs and in-store consultations, in establishing brand trust. The session demonstrated how creative, insight-driven communication and persistence can cut through market noise and drive quantifiable business results.

## ENTREPRENEURSHIP GUEST LECTURE

In a session with Mr. Kirthivasan Perialwar, MD, and Mr. Manjunath V. S, Director of Akihiro Technologies, students gained key insights on creating a sustainable lastmile delivery vehicle. ## INSPIRA DISTINGUISHED SPEAKER SERIES

#### Mr. William E Donald

The 13th LEGACY Distinguished Speaker Session, sponsored by Inspira X Empresario, was attended by Mr. William E. Donald, Associate Professor at the University of Southampton and founder of Donald Research & Consulting. A two-decade veteran of employability and sustainable careers, Mr. Donald presented the Employability Capital Growth Model (ECGM), a strategic model that unites personal and external variables to improve career opportunities. He emphasized nine core dimensions such as social, cultural, psychological, and economic capital. The session gave students, graduates, and professionals pragmatic tools to match their strengths against market requirements and institutional demands, facilitating longterm career growth.

#### Mr. Subin Jacob

The 14th session, held at XIME Kochi, featured Mr. Subin Jacob, Vice President & Head of Credit for Partnerships Acquisitions at Capital One Trade Credit. With 23+ years of experience in credit risk and financial strategy, he shared his journey "From Ernakulam to Capital One." Mr. Jacob offered insights into the evolving financial sector, emphasizing skills like domain expertise, problem-solving, and strategic execution. Through real-life experiences from consumer lending and fraud prevention, he gave students a realistic view of what it takes to succeed in finance. The session ended with an engaging Q&A on leadership and decision-making.

#### Ms. K Padmavathy

The 15th LEGACY session featured Ms. K. Padmavathy, IRS, Commissioner of Customs (Preventive), Kochi. With 18+ years in customs enforcement, she delivered an inspiring talk on "Leadership, Governance, and the Role of Customs Enforcement in National Security." She highlighted operations across airports, ports, and marine units and her success in preventing revenue losses worth ₹300 crores. Sharing her choice to pursue civil services over medicine, she emphasized ethical leadership, national duty, and courage. Her story left a lasting impact on students, inspiring them to lead with integrity and purpose.

#### Mr. Anil Bhaskaran

In the 16th session, finance was simplified by Mr. Anil Bhaskaran, VP – Architecture & Platform Advisory at SAP, through his talk on "Introduction to Securities Market." He broke down workings of capital markets, explained types of risks, and shared investment strategies inspired by global financial icons. Mr. Bhaskaran stressed the importance of early savings, compounding, and staying informed in a fast-paced market. The session not only offered financial literacy but also encouraged students to become financially savvy and future-ready.

#### **Dr. Varghese Manaloor**

The 17th session, led by Dr. Varghese Manaloor from the University of Alberta, Canada, spotlighted the critical issue of food security. His talk, "Food Security in Indian States: Analysis of Recent Progress and Policy Implications," explored the four pillars availability, access, utilization, and stability. Using data and econometric models, he analyzed regional disparities and policy gaps.
